Colorado Office of Economic Development and International Trade (OEDIT)

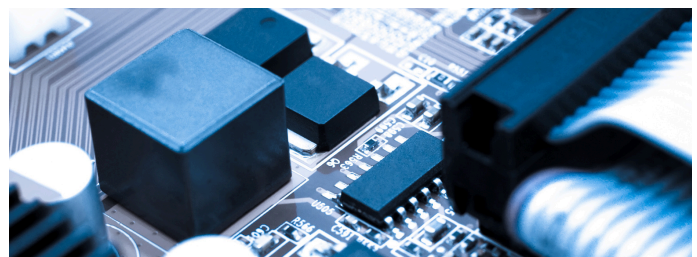
